Who Is in Your Family?

- **1** If someone asked, "Who is in your family?" what would you say? When someone says *family* do you think of all of your relatives? Or do you think only about your parents and your brothers and sisters?
- 2 An old Chinese saying is, "True happiness is three generations living together under one roof." That means that children, parents, and grandparents all live together. In Chinese society, older people are very respected. Adult children should take care of their parents when they get old. And there is another advantage. If grandparents live in the same house, they can help take care of the young children, especially when the parents need to work.
- 3 However, in the United States and in many western countries, there is a different idea. In the west, people like to be independent and self-sufficient. That means that they are uncomfortable if they need to depend on another person. They like to be independent and to live by themselves. For this reason, most older Americans live by themselves in houses and apartments. Sometimes, they may move to a special place for older people. These are called retirement homes or retirement communities. Many people do not want to live in the same house as their children or grandchildren. They might feel that they are in the way.
- **4** So how do you decide who is in your family? One way to look at the family is in what is called the *nuclear family*. A nuclear family is a father, a mother, and their children. All members of a nuclear family live together in the same house or apartment. In the west, the nuclear family is the basic family unit.
- **5** Another way to look at the family is in what is called an *extended family*. An extended family also includes father, mother, and children. But it also includes grandparents, grandchildren, aunts, uncles, and cousins. It is unlikely that all members of an extended family live together. The extended family is the basic family unit in many Middle Eastern, Asian, and Latin American countries.
